Projects

1. New Orphan-Care Homes

Immediately following the January 12, 2010 earthquake, we took in an additional 53 homeless and orphaned children. In total we now have 131 orphaned children in our care. Currently the newest children in our care are being housed in our church building until new housing can be built to accommodate all of them. In addition, post-earthquake, we had two of the homes we were renting in our village professionally inspected for safety. Upon inspection we were told they were not seismically safe. Those homes were evacuated and the children and staff relocated to the church and/or our boy's home on our compound.

We have purchased a piece of property, adjacent to our current compound, upon which we would like to build a cluster of new orphan-care homes. It is our hope that these homes will provide more of a family-type of setting, and less of an institutional setting. Each home will house 10-12 children with house parents living with them. A home for our special needs children would be built to accommodate their medical needs, with a live-in nurse and necessary equipment. We will need to house approximately 60 children and staff. We have started to receive plans and bids for these homes and believe that each home can be constructed for approximately \$80,000, and we will need five homes. We are seeking donations and funding to provide for the construction, furnishing/supplying, and ongoing support for these homes.

2. Children's Medical Clinic

There is a crisis in Haiti when it comes to adequate medical care for children. On our property in Ouanaminthe, Haiti a three story 15,000 square foot children's medical clinic is under construction. The *Danita's Children's Medical Clinic* will provide much needed life-giving healthcare and education to our children, and children in the surrounding region. The focus of the clinic will be pediatrics, centering on treatment, education, and prevention. We anticipate thousands of children will be seen and treated at this facility each year.

The *Children's Medical Clinic* is planned to provide:

- A Surgical Center
- Diagnostic Center
- Laboratory for medical testing
- Pharmacy
- Pediatric Dental Clinic
- Pediatric Optometry Clinic
- Examination rooms

- A hospital ward with 6 beds/cribs
- Two isolation rooms for infectious disease
- Efficiency living quarters for Clinic Manager
- Two dormitory rooms to house medical mission teams (up to 10 people)

The Clinic's construction has been partially funded. Furnishings, supplies and equipment, as well as ongoing operational expenses remain to be funded.

Goal for Completion: January 2011

3. Technology Education and Improvement Program

To provide increased tools, education and resources through improved technology equipment and connectivity.

For the School: 18 new desktop computers and internet connection to provide technology training and education to prepare our students for increased opportunities as adults in today's global community. Educational software and applications would be helpful

For our offices in Haiti: 4 new computers with MS Office software. Increased technology tools and connectivity would allow us to maintain administrative records and communications with supporters, and stateside offices and to manage our child sponsorship program Won-by-One in greater and more efficient and effective ways.

For the Medical Clinic and Future Hospital: Three computers and database for record-keeping, tools and technology for diagnostics and treatment, and for communication and conferral with medical teams and health-care organizations stateside.

Our compound is a 'green field' in the sense that it needs a completely new set-up for satellite internet connectivity, wireless routing, and computers. We have highly-qualified technicians and experts who have agreed to donate their analysis, planning and time to this cause. Funding for the expense of equipment and ongoing upkeep is needed.

Goal for Completion: September 2010

4. Feeding and Clothing Programs

Our feeding and clothing programs are ongoing, important recurring expenses. Because we have doubled the number of children in our care post-earthquake, our feeding and clothing expenses have also doubled.

We currently are feeding on average 18,000 meals each month through our feeding program. This includes feeding of the children in our homes, the school children (one meal

each day), our staff and various Haitian-run orphanages and families in the community that we support.

Our clothing budget includes clothing for the children living in our homes, our school uniforms for all the children and shoes for more than 600 children. Because of the dirty terrain in Haiti, new shoes must be purchased or provided approximately every three to four months.

5. Future and Planned Educational Projects

Eleven years ago, in 1999, Danita took in her first orphaned child, Robenson. Today Robenson is 18 years old and has plans to study international law with the goal of one day being a leader in his country. While he still has three more years of high school remaining, we know that it is not too soon to consider the future of all of the children with us as they age out of our care and transition into adulthood. We believe our children can be the change-makers in Haiti. Therefore, we are looking at ways to prepare them for a brighter future. Education and training is a key to helping them find their potential. The following are projects and programs we have identified that will help us achieve this goal.

Trade and Vocation School

An educational program and facility that will include training initially in five main areas of focus:

- i. Carpentry/Ironworks
- ii. Sewing and textile industry preparation
- iii. Farming and agriculture
- iv. Manufacturing and Export
- v. Art

Prominent needs for the Trade and Vocation School will include staff, curriculum, equipment and facilities.

Leadership Academy

The Leadership Academy concept has been born from the observed need that Haitian children would highly benefit from additional and focused training in the areas of leadership, character and integrity development. The Leadership Academy would be a specialty track that will run concurrent with their secondary education and would be provided to students who attain the privilege to attend based upon their attendance record, grades and commitment by them and their family to their education. Students

would be trained for the purpose of leadership and the education would provide them with skills and a focus after they leave our school. A special curriculum will be sought to provide this specialty training.

Prominent needs for the Leadership Academy will include staff and curriculum.

College Fund Sponsorship Program

Our children have big goals. Through our care and education, many of our children have come to realize that there is a potential to do more, be more and help more. Children like young Junette who became part of the Danita's Children family when her parents died from AIDS. Junette, now fourteen, has aspirations to become a doctor, work in our hospital, and help save the lives of children in Haiti. Without a proper education, she won't be able to achieve this dream. With help from our College Fund Sponsorship Program, Junette will have the opportunity to attend medical school and become a doctor.

6. Danita's Children Hospital of Hope

Architectural plans have been completed, and the land purchased and cleared in preparation for a 31,000 square foot, fully functional, state-of-the-art, 44-bed, in-patient pediatric hospital. This hospital will be adjacent to our current compound, and will provide for the increased need for pediatric healthcare in Haiti and the region. Upon completion of this hospital, the Medical Clinic will be used for out-patient care, education and housing.
